Home Group will start again on Tuesday 10 October and will run fortnightly up until Christmas.

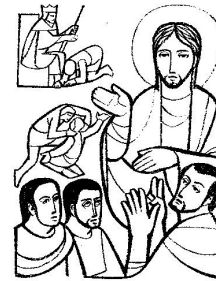
