Partnership for Missional church update: The first phase in the PMC project is to find out from the congregation where they feel St James is now as a church. An important first step in this will consist of undertaking a qualitative research project based on interviewing a sample of the congregation to find out what they feel about various aspects of belonging to St James. In order to get a representative sample of the congregation based on things like gender, age, length of time in the congregation, we are not asking for
