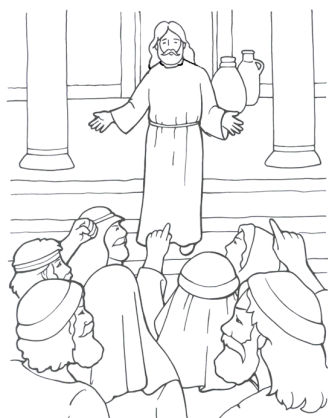

Partnership for Missional church update: The first phase in the PMC project is to find out from the congregation where they feel St James is now as a church. An important first step in this will consist of undertaking a qualitative research project based on interviewing a sample of the congregation to find out what they feel about various aspects of belonging to St James. In order to get a representative sample of the congregation based on things like gender, age, length of time in the congregation, we are not asking for volunteers, rather we will be selecting the sample and approaching people directly. If you are approached and would rather not take part, please feel free to decline. But, of course, we hope you will want to be involved. There will be plenty of opportunity for the congregation as a whole to input their views into the process as time goes on, so please don't feel left out if you are not selected. You will definitely get opportunities to make your views known at other times.

On Sunday 29 July we will be holding our **St James' Day bring and share lunch** (not barbecue as previously advertised) in the church garden at 12.30 pm. Everyone is welcome to come along. Offers of help with setting up and clearing away, and donations of salads, savouries and desserts, would be very welcome. Folksongs of Praise. Our 10 o'clock Sunday service on 5 August will be a time of informal worship in the folk music tradition. All ages are welcome and musicians are invited to bring an instrument if they wish. The service will last about an hour with refreshments afterwards.
